



## Articulation Agreement Between Middlesex County College and Sherman College of Straight Chiropractic

This agreement is designed to facilitate transfer from Middlesex County College to Sherman College of Straight Chiropractic for students desiring the Doctor of Chiropractic (DC) degree.

Sherman College of Straight Chiropractic will guarantee admission to students from Middlesex County College who meet the following provisions:

1. Students must have successfully completed the prescribed curriculum as outlined in the *Articulation Agreement*.
2. No grade below "C" (2.0) will be accepted for transfer to Sherman College.
3. Students must have earned a minimum 2.50 cumulative grade point average (*2.60 in 2008, 2.70 in 2009, 2.80 in 2010, 2.90 in 2011 and 3.00 in 2012*) and a minimum 2.50 grade point average in the core courses required for admission to Sherman College.
4. Students will be granted tentative acceptance upon completion of a minimum 45 semester hours with final acceptance granted upon receipt of the student's final transcript from MCC.

Middlesex County College may use this agreement and the name of Sherman College of Straight Chiropractic in the official College Catalog and in other ways to promote the successful implementation of this agreement and to communicate its contents to all involved participants.

This agreement may be altered at any time by mutual consent. Termination of the agreement by either party requires at least one year written notice.

## Middlesex County College and Sherman College of Straight Chiropractic Pre-Chiropractic Articulation Agreement

The prerequisite, pre-professional, academic requirement for admission to the doctor of chiropractic program is 90.0 semester hours credits. Two educational options shall be available for Middlesex County College students:

1. A Middlesex County College student may participate in a Two-Plus-One-Plus-One agreement, whereby students complete the first two years at MCC, then transfer to an approved, participating, four-year institution for one year of additional study. Following the successful completion of the first year at Sherman College, the student will be awarded a bachelor's degree from the four-year institution as they continue toward the completion of their professional studies with Sherman College.
2. Those Middlesex County College students not desiring to earn a bachelor's degree may complete all 90 required prerequisite semester hour credits at Middlesex County College and apply directly for transfer into the first year of the professional program at Sherman College.
