

# High School Scholars Program

The High School Scholars Program provides eligible students the opportunity to earn Middlesex County College credit while still in high school.

## ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Applicants must be 15 years of age at the time of registration and in their 2<sup>nd</sup> marking period of 10th grade (sophomore year) in high school.
- Applicants must complete a High School Scholars application and obtain proper signatures of approval from a parent or guardian and a guidance counselor prior to registering for a course.
- Applicants must meet all pre-requisites for the course selected. Placement testing may be required for certain courses.
- Home-school applicants must be 15 years of age at the time of registration and provide a transcript reflecting coursework equivalent to that of 10th grade.\*  
\*Proof of age and academic department approval may be required.

## TUITION AND FEES

- Courses taken on-campus or on-line during Fall, Spring, and Summer semesters: **Full tuition and fees\***
- Courses taken through dual enrollment at a participating high school: **\$200/course**
